#### From the Interim Pastor

Our Lenten Journey – 2017 The Groom and His Brides! It's a bit strange to think of Jesus, the Groom, and the Roman Catholic Church as His Bride. John the Baptist signals this relationship in the Gospel

of John (3:29) when he said, "The bridegroom (Jesus) is the one to whom the bride (the church) belongs" The Roman Catholic Church has affirmed this feminine nature of its relationship to Jesus as a logical expression of the intimacy between Christ, the head of the Body and the church as a bride "bethrothed" to Christ the Lord. The early disciples and Jesus, himself, never considered the possibility of more than one bride, one church. But, low and behold, God's unexpected servant, the miner's son, a would be lawyer turned Monk, Father and Professor Martin Luther on October 31, 1517posted 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Castle Church that upset the apple cart! His separation from the Roman Catholic Church resulted in many brides (churches) married to the one Lord, Jesus Christ, the bridegroom! The Groom and His Brides!

The Reformation changed a lot of things! Today, 500 years later we still struggle with our "denominationalism" contrasted with Jesus' prayer that "they all may be one" (John 17:21) Yet, in the rich diversity of theological expressions we are closer now to "unity in diversity" than we have ever been. This century holds out the promise of a visible unity among Christians thought to be only a vain hope because of the chaotic, but freeing, 16<sup>th</sup> Century Reformation. During our Lenten Journey this year. you are invited to worship (using Marty Haugen's beautiful "Holden Evening Prayer Service" and to conversation (using Martin Luther's Small Catechism). We will explore the dynamic relevance of the fundamentals of our faith around the table of conversation (Pot Luck at 5:30 PM) and in the quietude of worship (6:30 PM in the Sanctuary). Come and grow together as brothers and sisters in Christ and as Christians seeking to once more unite the Body of Christ to His only Bride, the church!

#### Old Business:

**Review and Approve Remaining Parsonage Bids** 

Lee presented one bid for recommendation. There is a possibility that additional bids for concrete and carpentry may still come in. We discussed the site building plans. Craig made a motion to accept the recommendation from the building committee of \$198,608 including appliances with two possible adds-on — one going with a 9-foot concrete wall and the other to add a dormer to the front door, if we can keep it under \$200,000. Melody seconded the motion.

Randy asked if anyone on the building committee has thought of a project manager for this project. Lee said he would check with some people.

Review and Discuss Financing Options – Craig sent out three parsonage financing options with summaries. He had asked for a loan on \$170,000 from Neighboring National Bank, Security State Bank and Bremer Bank. When the home arrives in Grand Rapids, approximately mid-April, we will need to write a check. Neighborhood National Bank was recommended from the options given and Craig said he would complete any of the paper work, along with Mary Braun. He will get the documents together. An electronic motion will be made among the council members, when approval is needed.

Update on Capital Appeal Planning – Val Benton, Parish House Fund Drive chairperson, has sent out an introductory letter to the congregation explaining the fund drive to purchase a new prebuilt parish house. A follow-up letter with a form will be sent out next week. A notice will also be in the newsletter. It was brought up that the letter was sent out in bulk and are not forwarded to the snowbirds was a concern. Snowbirds should give the church secretary their winter address. A suggestion of enlarging the floor plan and displaying it at church, for others to visually see, was made. The council extends its thanks to Val for all her work and leadership.

Call Committee Update – Ron reported that we have one name for the Call Committee so far. It was suggested to run the call application in the March newsletter. Pastor Terry is also mentioning it on Sundays when he gives his announcements. Deadline is April.

**Website Update** – Mary and Judie went over content in a little more detail. We have picked a theme and color scheme. Getting closer to going live.

Present House Removal — It will be late March or early April.

### New Business:

**2017 Insurance Renewal** — Property insurance needs to be renewed in April. Our insurance needs to be updated with new parsonage addition. We

need to meet with Oberfeld Insurance and Randy suggested to include one or two more council member to attend insurance meeting. Meeting is Thursday, April 6.

Lent, the season of the church year that's associated with repentance, begins on Ash Wednesday (March 5 this year). While some people deny themselves by giving up something for Lent, others prepare for Easter through special Bible studies or devotions.

Christians observe Lent for these reasons:

- It causes us to STOP. Lent says, "Stop and rest awhile," as well as "Stop doing wrong."
- It tells us to LOOK. Look inward for an honest self-examination. Look upward to see the cross of Christ offering healing and love. Look forward to the hope of the Resurrection.
- It tells us to LISTEN. Listen to the words of Christ. Listen to the voice of God. Listen to the winds of the Spirit of God.

Stop, look and listen. These three words aren't only important for our safety in travel; they're also helpful for our journey through the 40 days of Lent.
