Minutes of March 21, 2017 Council Meeting

<u>In attendance:</u> Randy Tofteland, Mary Braun, Lee Forrester, Craig Kullberg, Melody Lackner, Pastor Terry Frovik, Ron Mehlhop, Tom Christenson and Judie Birk.

The meeting was called to order by council president, Randy Tofteland. Pastor Terry Frovik gave opening Devotions.

Secretary's Report:

Motion was made to accept the minutes of the February meeting by Lee Forrester, seconded by Mary Braun, and passed.

Treasurer's Report:

Financial view and current month activity for February was presented by Mary Braun. Motion was made by Ron to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Craig and passed.

Offerings were low in February in comparison to last month because we had 5 Sundays in January and 4 in Feb. Also, one of the Vanco deposits that typically go in on the first of February was deposited on January 31st. So last month's offerings were high, but we are still down from our budgeted numbers, and more importantly, YTD is down. This is the slow time of year for giving as a lot of people are away.

Pass Thru: \$2100 - We had been paying Pastor Terry for his retirement in his monthly paycheck. We thought he was paying Portical, he thought we were paying Portical. He returned the 3 months of retirement pay we included in his paycheck (\$700/month), and then paid Portical. Since it was already coded as Payroll Retirement item, I took the \$2100 in as a Pass Thru and paid Portical as a Pass Thru. Going forward, it will have a separate line item, paid directly to Portical, and coded as a Payroll Retirement item.

Memorials: We receive \$2000+ in Memorials this past month. The majority of Memorials, YTD, is Church Choice.

Classes Taught: Bible Study 9, Old Business:

Update on Capital Appeal — Valerie Benton has a couple mailings sent out. We have received twenty pledges so far. Additional forms are available at the church if you did not receive one. Please continue to 'Raise it up!" and pledge. Show your commitment.

Finalize Parsonage Mortgage — Council Discussion We have a tentative signing date for the loan on Thursday, April 6 at 2 pm at Bethesda

We will only be signing one instrument that includes both the construction phase and the final mortgage The construction phase will start when we request our first proceeds from the bank. This is anticipated to be in April when we pay Midway Homes

We can then draw on the loan to pay contractors throughout the project, or use our own cash We will pay interest only on the loan monthly through the construction period

When the project is complete, we confirm the final mortgage with the bank. If that is less than the amount we've financed during the construction phase we write a check to the bank and begin payments of principal and interest

Rate of the loan is 4.75% for both the construction phase and 5-year balloon that will be amortized over 20 years

A motion to authorize Randy Tofteland and Mary Braun to execute the parsonage loan through Neighborhood National Bank for a 5-year balloon mortgage that will be amortized over 20 years at a rate of 4.75% was made by Lee Forrester and second by Ron Mehlhop.

Call Committee Update – Steve Lackner came in to talk about the Call Committee update. He said we still need volunteers as only two people have committed so far to being on the committee. Council agreed that volunteers could forgo the application form. A few names were suggested for Steve to ask. Please consider volunteering.

Website Update – Council reviewed website and it was well received. There are a few items that need to be added. Meanwhile, council and committee chairpersons for their input will review the site before going live. Our goal is to be up before Easter!.

New Business:

Dakota Roads Concert — Pastor brought to Worship and Music the suggestion to bring in a band to promote ourselves and have a celebration. Great idea, but council decided the timing wasn't but that Worship and Music should discuss again and bring back to council at a later date.

Heartland Conference for Church Secretaries and Admin — An email that was sent to Randy regarding this conference. This is part of the synod and is an event that will be held at Camp Onamia for church office staff. It sounded like a good conference for sharing ideas on networking with other churches. Cost is \$25. It would be a great opportunity for our office staff along with a few other members. Council is in support of this.

Adopt a Highway — Bethesda has participated for several years in the Adopt-a-Highway program (two miles along Hwy. 47) and it needs to be renewed annually. Mary Vukelich asked if the Boys Scouts could help. Jerry Morris is willing to oversee them when they do this. Parishioners can also join them. Question to council is do we still want to be responsible for this? Discussion was that we hate to see this go. It's a good service project for the church and God Bless those Boys Scouts to help!

STROKE IDENTIFICATION:



Stroke has a new indicator they say if you email this to ten people, you stand a chance of saving one life. Will you send this along? Blood Clots/Stroke - They Now Have a Fourth Indicator, the Tongue

I will continue to forward this every time it comes around!

STROKE: Remember the 1st Three Letters..... S. T. R.

STROKE IDENTIFICATION:

During a BBQ, a woman stumbled and took a little fall - she assured everyone that she was fine (they offered to call paramedics) ...she said she had just tripped over a brick because of her new shoes. They got her cleaned up and got her a new plate of food. While she appeared a bit shaken up, Jane went about enjoying herself the rest of the evening. Jane's husband called later telling everyone that his wife had been taken to the hospital - (at 6:00 PM Jane passed away.) She had suffered a stroke at the BBQ. Had they known how to identify the signs of a stroke, perhaps Jane would be with us today. Some don't die. They end up in a helpless, hopeless condition instead.

It only takes a minute to read this.

A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within 3 hours he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke...totally. He said the trick was getting a stroke recognized, diagnosed, and then getting the patient medically cared for within 3 hours, which is tough.

RECOGNIZING A STROKE

Thank God for the sense to remember the '3' steps, STR. Read and Learn!

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke.

Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

S *Ask the individual to SMILE.

T *Ask the person to TALK and SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently) (I.e. Chicken Soup) R *Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.

If he or she has trouble with ANY ONE of these tasks, call emergency number immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

New Sign of a Stroke ------

Stick out Your Tongue!

NOTE: Another 'sign' of a stroke is this: Ask the person to 'stick' out his tongue. If the tongue is 'Crooked', if it goes to one side or the other that is also an indication of a stroke.

A cardiologist says if everyone who gets this e-mail sends it to 10 people; you can bet that at least one life will be saved. I have done my part. Will you?



Christian symbol-Palms

When Jesus entered Jerusalem days before his death, crowds welcomed him by waving palm branches, which were common symbols of victory and rejoicing. Thus churches continue to use them in remembrance of that occasion, knowing that Jesus' crucifixion was ultimately his triumph over sin and death. As early as Leviticus 23:40, God commanded Israel to use palms in a festival of rejoicing. In Revelation 7:9-10, Christian martyrs carry palm branches as they praise the Lamb before the throne of God.
