

As we come into this Holy Place, let us contemplate the meaning of Christ's death. Before the service this morning, pray for a better understanding of this passion event. Read one of the penitential Psalms #6, or #139(in the Cranberry Hymnal) to be reminded again of man's weakness in the sight of God.

THE LITANY OF THE CROSS

P: O Holy Spirit of God, you spoke through the prophets of long ago; may we today hear their words and feel the messages they proclaimed and see the fulfillment of their speaking in the bold actions on our behalf which you have taken in the person of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. All we, like sheep, have gone astray.

C: We have turned, every one, to our own way.

P: It is our nature to rebel against you, O God, and to presume that we can put ourselves in your place; but in Baptism, you received us and called forth from us belief and trust.

C: Continue to grant us your forgiveness and seek us out, calling us to the way of truth.

P: May we never forget, O God, the suffering which Jesus endured at the hands of sinful people. Let us blame no others, for it was sin like ours that nailed Him to the tree.

C: We rejoice that Jesus trusted in you, O God, and that you carried Him through suffering to victory.

P: Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows.

C: Yet we have thought of him as being stricken down, beaten by God, and hurt.

P: Heavenly Father, although we do not deserve your love, you have gone far beyond our wishes or dreams to conquer the sin which would control us.

C: You have set us free from sin and death through the obedient sacrifice of Jesus, your Son.

P: We are deeply thankful that Jesus' death and resurrection is the effective gift of our salvation.

C: You have covered the sins of all repentant peoples of every time and every place.

P: You gave Christ the victory, O God; as he has conquered sin and death, so may we, through him, be made victors, and be set free from slavery to sin.

C: Give us your gift of eternal life that we may stand in your holy presence! Amen!

THE CONFESSION

P: Let us humbly make confession unto God, imploring His forgiveness through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

C: O God, our Heavenly Father, I confess unto Thee that I have grievously sinned against Thee in many ways; not only by outward transgressions, but also by secret thoughts and desires which I cannot fully understand, but which are all known unto Thee. I do earnestly repent, and am heartily sorry for these my offenses, and I beseech thee of Thy great goodness to have mercy upon me, and for the sake of Thy Dear Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, to forgive my sins and graciously to help my infirmities. Amen.

P Almighty God, our heavenly Father, hath had mercy upon us and for the sake of the sufferings, death and resurrection of His dear Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, forgives us all our sins. As a Minister of the Church of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore declare unto you who do truly repent and believe in Him, the entire forgiveness of all your sins; In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. **Amen.**

THE GOSPEL LESSON:

John 18:15-27

¹⁸ “If the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first. ¹⁹If you belonged to the world, it would love you as its own. As it is, you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world. That is why the world hates you. ²⁰Remember what I told you: ‘A servant is not greater than his master.’ If they persecuted me, they will persecute you also. If they obeyed my teaching, they will obey yours also. ²¹They will treat you this way because of my name, for they do not know the one who sent me. ²²If I had not come and spoken to them, they would not be guilty of sin; but now they have no excuse for their sin. ²³Whoever hates me hates my Father as well. ²⁴If I had not done among them the works no one else did, they would not be guilty of sin. As it is, they have seen, and yet they have hated both me and my Father. ²⁵But this is to fulfill what is written in their Law: ‘They hated me without reason.’ ²⁶“When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father—the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father—he will testify about me. ²⁷And you also must testify, for you have been with me from the beginning.

THE GOOD FRIDAY PRAYER

P Ashes to ashes, dust to dust. There is the smell of death in the air.

C: It is death we smell. Jesus our Lord is walking toward Jerusalem.

P: A bitter walk, a lonely walk, a painful walk, a passionate walk.

C: To die, to die a cruel death, an agonizing death, an unjust death.

P: But a compassionate death, a necessary death.

ALL: Ashes to ashes, dust to dust, O Lord on Your way to death, have mercy on us.

P: Oh my people, O my church, what have I done to you? How have I offended you?

Answer me. I led you out of slavery into freedom, and delivered you through the waters of rebirth, but you have prepared a cross for your Savior.

ALL: Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal, have mercy on us. Amen.

ALL: Ashes to ashes, dust to dust, O Lord on Your way to death, have mercy on us.

P: We need to die, too.

C: We need to die to everything that keeps God out and love from flowing.

P: But we did die already. We died with Him. In the waters of Baptism, in his Body and Blood.

C: So we can live. That's why He died, so we can live.

P: There is forgiveness. There is mercy. There is peace.

C: There is joy in dying, His dying, and our dying. That's why He died.

P: He is the only answer. We need that answer.

P: We are sorry. We are very sorry. Remember He walks to His death for you to die with Him.

C: Remember He walks to His death for you to live.

THE POUNDING OF THE NAILS


*As we close our service, all adults are asked to come forward
