From the Pastor

"I swear to tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, so help me God." Even those of us who have never spent time in a courtroom

have probably heard this phrase on innumerable TV shows and movies. One hand in the air, the other on the Bible, reciting the words with utter seriousness before the judge, the jury, plaintiffs, defendants, all the lawyers, and all those listening with rapt attention. Despite how common this scene has become both in our real world and in our entertainment, we can forget that this concern for truth, the whole truth, is also clearly found in the Bible.

The sin of bearing false witness doesn't just reside in the 10 Commandments alone but appears multiple times in both the Old and New Testament. In Psalm 27, David laments that false witnesses have risen against him, seeking to destroy him. The twenty-fifth chapter of Proverbs preaches that bearing false witness against your neighbor is nothing less than an act of violence against your neighbor, the words wound as much as any club or sword or sharp arrow. Of course, we should also not forget that even Jesus heard false testimonies offered against him in his trial.

This commandment may sometimes seem the odd man out, and yet, more than ever, it is needed in our modern-day society. We live in an age where we have (rightly) developed a healthy skepticism and have begun to challenge long-held beliefs and practices, ingrained patterns that benefit some but cause suffering for others. However, sometimes our skepticism and cynicism goes too far, and we inadvertently set ourselves adrift. We get to this point where we so expect someone to be taking a side, promoting an agenda, and blindly reciting a set of talking points that we don't expect to ever hear the truth and don't even see breadcrumbs leading us to it. "Everyone is biased," we think, and so we just pick the bias that feels right to us.

As a people of God, we endeavor to be truthtellers, the-whole-truth-tellers, and nothing but. The truth of Jesus Christ, son of God, stirs this up in us. And the truth is not always pretty. Speaking the truth so often moves us to repentance, asking God's forgiveness for all that we have done and all that we have failed to do. But we also get to speak the truth of God's love *for* us and the way that God's love can work *through* all of us, working to mend and build up where sin has broken and beat us down.

Assuming there isn't a massive wave of negative feedback in the Worship & Music survey regarding our summer series, we will join several area churches in using the Narrative Lectionary this Fall. This set of readings focuses on one main reading each Sunday, beginning in the book of Genesis and choosing selections through the whole Bible, ending in the New Testament epistles in the Spring. Though I am fond of the previous schedule of readings, I especially appreciate how much easier it is to observe the whole story of God's relationship with his people. All the ups, all the downs. All the times that God blessed them abundantly. All the times when the abundance went to their heads and they forgot God, forgot to be just and generous to all. All the times when they sowed the seeds of their own punishment. And all the times that God saw them through their suffering and brought forgiveness and renewal.

This is our story too. God's truth is out there, even when we struggle with the concept. We should be nervous when humans offer claims of absolute truth — when their view is unquestionably the right one and everything else is a lie. But neither should we be so jaded that we no longer care and just accept that might makes right.

Christ teaches us another path. We all sin and fall short, and so speaking the full truth of God's love requires that we speak even those uncomfortable truths about ourselves. Truth demands humility. The full power of God's love is only shown when we see that it comes in forgiveness and unmerited grace. And then, as we are loved and forgiven, we are moved to love and forgive others.

So, when the world seems chaotic and meaningless, take heart my friends – as Jesus said to those who believed in him: "You are truly my disciples if you remain faithful to my teaching. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

Secretary's Report:

Motion was made to accept the minutes of the July meeting by Mary Braun, seconded by Melody, and passed.

Treasurer's Report:

Financial view and current month activity for July was presented by Mary Braun. Motion was made by Melody Lackner to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Kathy Berland and passed.

Pastor's Report:

- Led worship service at Aicota and Aitkin Health services
- Considering doing self-guided Continuing Ed for creative computer software (for example video production)
- Took a few days of vacation time when family was up visiting
- Participated in the new centennial committees (main & monthly)
- Continuing to help with praise band; Praise Team offered to pay for Pastor Terry providing coverage on 8/12
- Continuing work with synod committee for building better relationships with our native neighbors ("Together Here"); they recently sponsored a presentation by a history professor in Duluth, considering a possible event in October in our area
- Thank you for those working on the parsonage's new back deck, and for those who donated

• I will help promote and organize a community garden committee, if there is enough interest

Old Business:

Mutual Ministry Committee — Mary Braun printed out a copy of the Synod's description of the role for the Mutual Ministry Committee. Council members are to review and will discuss at next meeting. Randy Tofteland has volunteered to chair when committee is defined.

Job Descriptions for committees should have been submitted.

New Business:

Disaster Relief — Jerry Morris introduced Stacy Durgin from Health and Human Resources of Aitkin County. She toured our facility with Jerry a few weeks ago and they believe our church would be a good fit for disaster-type emergencies that occur in our area. We would have a memorandum of understanding with Aitkin County and would not be committed if our church was unavailable. We would be on a list that the county would call and ask if we are available. If our facility would be needed for overnight, the county would provide cots and provide any overnight help. She suggests that we let our congregation know that this is available. We would need a list of volunteers to be here if we would need to open the doors. Jerry believes this is a community commitment that our church should be committed too. Mary Braun made a motion that Bethesda Lutheran Church be open for emergency disaster assistance when needed. Motion was seconded by George Smith and passed.

Stewardship Committee proposed a Project Request Form Expense sheet to be filled out for any large purchases. They will need to record where the money come from and if it is it their budget. This is to have the council accountable for the monies spent. It was suggested by council to add a dollar amount on the large purchase line to the form.

Revised Budget worksheets were reviewed by council and will include a pastor pay increase. A motion was made by Ron Mehlhop and seconded by Melody Lackner to accept the revised budget suggestions.

Judie Birk reported on the Church's 100th Anniversary Celebration plans which are underway. A picnic/pig roast is being planned for August 11, 2019 with Praise choirs from other churches to be invited. A monthly calendar with historical facts is being created and will be available for year 2019. Monthly activities to engage our congregation throughout next year have been planned. Fundraising was discussed.

Council member election and terms were discussed. We will be looking for two 3-year term council members at this year's annual meeting. We encourage council members to look for recruits.
