From the Pastor

Greetings sisters and brothers in Christ!

Next month will mark my one-year anniversary as your pastor. My time spent in Malmo and at

Bethesda has truly been a blessing. Inevitably, anniversaries like this inspire reflection – the successes, the mistakes, the areas still yet to explore. Maybe pastor and congregation are both still in a bit of a “honeymoon” phase, with everything still seeming cute and charming. While I am not exactly opposed to this continuing as long as possible, I hope you do feel free in sharing any of your reflections – positive, negative, or otherwise – with me.

As a pastor, one of the most important duties of our call to ministry is also one of the most basic – listening. Even though I feel relatively confident in my listening abilities, it is one of the aspects of ministry I worry about the most. Preaching, teaching, working with committees, telling Ole and Lena jokes at the Jamboree, all of these might have their moments of anxiety, but it is tough to screw them up too badly. A boring sermon is not ideal, but at least that gives you time for a little nap or to plan out where you want to go to lunch after church.

But listening, listening isn't just “basic,” it is foundational. It lays the groundwork for so much of what follows. Trying to find the right words in all the twists and turns of life is no easy task, but where I have regrets about my time as a pastor thus far, most of them revolve around fears that I didn't really hear what someone was trying to tell me, or I simply missed out on opportunities *to* listen in the first place.

Of course, as followers of Christ we are all called to listen, not just pastors. Some of us may be more innately skilled at it than others, but most of us are capable of sitting still and keeping our mouths closed for at least a few minutes at a time. And yet we still regularly find way to screw up something so simple (pastors included). How often do we find ourselves in a “debate” with another person where we are not really listening, but mostly just waiting for our turn to speak?

And how often do we miss (or avoid) opportunities to do something no more complicated than just sitting and listening? We acknowledge that we live in an increasingly divided country, and yet our mouths

continue to get far more exercise than our ears (or perhaps our fingers on social media). It is no easy task to flip our brains around and find a healthier balance.

One area in which our ears could use some exercise regards our native neighbors. It didn't take long after moving here last fall to realize that there are some significant tensions within our community. Though the epicenter of the tension is on Mille Lacs and walleye, it isn't hard to see how this issue gets everyone so on edge that progress on any other front is put at risk.

Recently, Randy Tofteland and I attended a training session hosted by our NE MN synod and the synod-wide committee, “Together Here,” that I serve on. It focused on an activity called a “blanket exercise” that offers a great overview of Native American history in a unique format. I hesitate to give away too much information beforehand but be assured that it is not just a lecture where you must sit still and fight off a nap, there is some movement as well.

What I also love about the blanket exercise is that while it tells some difficult truths, it isn't overly preachy or controversial. Freed from many of the buzzwords we hear around the lake, hopefully folks will be able to more deeply listen, and then, afterward, to discuss and ask questions in a bit calmer atmosphere.

So please keep an eye out for future announcements about a blanket exercise hosted either here at Malmo or somewhere nearby. If anyone would like to help with this exercise and other possible efforts at building better relationships with our native neighbors, please feel free to let me know. I know it is a bit short notice, but I am planning a meeting in late afternoon/early evening of Monday, October 8 here at Bethesda to discuss some of these issues and some initial steps to take in our church and area. This meeting will hopefully include some folks from other area Lutheran congregations.

Thanks again for all the wonderful ministry that flows out of this place, and for all the fun we have together. Not every moment is cheerful and stress-free, but hopefully the warm, inviting, forgiving, loving Spirit that fills our congregation and its members will see us through all the moments of our lives, whether comfy or tense... and might help us to open our ears and close our mouths now and then too.

Practicing with choir and praise band, preparing a solo, and Val has been working with me to help co-host. Should be fun! I took a week of vacation this past month (but no Sundays).

From Sunday, Sept 23, afternoon to Tues, Sept 25 I will be attending the Fall Theological Conference for our synod. It will held up near Grand Rapids and I was invited to give the sermon at the Sunday evening worship service.
