<u>RMD</u> Donate your annual RMD to charity and avoid the taxes. If you donate your RMD to a "qualified charitable distributions" (QCDs) it will not be added to your taxable income for the year. They must go directly to a charity designated as qualified by the IRS. Making a QCD as opposed to a normal charitable gift has two main advantages. First, a QCD counts toward satisfying the individual's required minimum distribution for that year. Second, the distribution is excluded from the taxpayer's income. Bethesda Lutheran Church is a QCD because it is a 501(c)(3) organization.
