

From the Pastor

"O'LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name throughout the earth! You made your glory higher than heaven! From the mouths of nursing babies you have laid a strong foundation because of your foes, in order to stop vengeful enemies."

When I look up at your skies, at what your fingers made—the moon and the stars that you set firmly in place—what are human beings that you think about them; what are human beings that you pay attention to them?¶

You've made them only slightly less than divine, crowning them with glory and grandeur. You've let them rule over your handiwork, putting everything under their feet—all sheep and all cattle, the wild animals too, the birds in the sky, the fish of the ocean, everything that travels the pathways of the sea. LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name throughout the earth!" (Psalm-8)¶

Greetings, brothers and sisters in Christ!

Our spring and early summer weather has admittedly been a bit of a mixed bag this year. However, there have indeed been, and no doubt will be, many days this summer when we remember why we live in Minnesota, surrounded by lakes and trees. On cool, quiet summer mornings or while watching the sun set over the lake, it is hard not to be filled with gratitude for the beauty of God's good creation all around us.

But as much as we delight in those moments, we hearty, small-town Minnesotans can have a tendency to prioritize the practical over the beautiful. Function over form. Given that most of the world over-emphasizes physical appearance and the newest, shiniest toys, we would do well to push back against those obsessions.

Yet neither should we eliminate beauty and wonder in our lives. The goal, I suppose, is to recognize a deeper and broader sense of beauty. So that we might see the wonderful work of God in more places, more people, more moments of our lives.

Beauty is part of the Christian faith and one of the great examples of this is found in the poetry of the Psalms. For part of June and most of July we will be focusing on the Psalms on Sunday morning. Some are more poetic than others, but I encourage you to try reading your way through the book of Psalms this summer. Most are fairly short, and it would be easy to read one or two a day and make your way through the whole Psalter before the days start turning cool again.

Of course, the Psalms also remind us that beauty is not always happy. Rather than just some empty, superficial

thrill, the beauty that God works in our world always speaks a truth, and so sometimes the poetry of the psalms speaks words of praise, and sometimes words of lament. As Prof. Diane Jacobson wrote recently in an article about poetry in the Psalms: "Our praise is related to promise and grace. Our praise surprises us with a God who meets us in our lament and takes us beyond. The poetry of praise transports us. Our questions are met by promise." Every day in our lives isn't filled with sunshine and singing birds. But God meets us in every moment of our lives, helping us to remember the beauty of his love, even when life seems pretty ugly. Wherever life may find you this month, may God find you and bring you a few beautiful moments of promise and grace.


