INTRODUCTION

God's work is messy business. Perhaps this messiness is part of the appeal of the narratives in the opening chapters of 2 Samuel. These chapters recount all of the tension in the movement of leadership from Saul to David, not merely a change of rulers, but a change in the house and a complete about-face in the previous endorsement of Saul. But in the midst of this chaos, even during the radical takeover of the throne, this week's passage reminds us that God's triumph endures.

Chapter 5
