#### From the Pastor

Then Moses called out to Joshua in the presence of all Israel, "Be strong and courageous, for you will accompany these people to the land that the LORD promised to give their ancestors, and you will enable them

to inherit it. The LORD is indeed going before you—he will be with you; he will not fail you or abandon you. Do not be afraid or discouraged!" Deuteronomy 31:7-8

Grace and peace to you!

I hope these words find you well, and that everyone is managing to stay safe and sane during these trying times! There is certainly no shortage of passages in the Bible that proclaim God's promise of love and protection in times of trial. Now would be a great time to read through the Psalms, for example. Yet, it was this passage from Deuteronomy that recently caught my attention.

Moses spoke these words – part blessing, part promise, part pep talk – to Joshua as the people of Israel were nearing the end of their time of wandering in the desert. They are on the cusp of crossing the Jordan and entering the promised land. And yet the Lord has made it clear to Moses that he will not be able to join them in seeing the end of their journey. In fact, in only a few chapters, Moses dies and is buried in the land of Moab, and then Deuteronomy ends, and the story continues in the book of Joshua. Joshua will be the one to lead them the final step of their journey and in the battles that will soon result from their arrival.

In one sense, they are facing the opposite problem from us. They are wandering, seeking to find a new home, while many of us are stuck at home. They are together in a one big group, while we are isolated. However, we both share a fear over an uncertain future. We both have our plans, and we both do our best to trust that everything will eventually work out. But still, we get nervous. It's hard to avoid. While Moses' advice is technically for Joshua, I think it is telling that he calls out to him when he is surrounded by the whole community. Perhaps this pep talk was meant as much for the people of Israel as for Joshua's ears alone. Right after this moment, the Lord appears as a pillar of cloud to Moses and Joshua in a tent, so God can commission properly, but it is Moses' blessing that is the big public

announcement.

Both leaders and the community as a whole need these reassurances. We need to be reminded, again and again, that God is with us. That God does not fail us or abandon us. To hear, as Joshua and everyone else heard, that we can trust that God goes before and beside us through whatever may come.

We need these reminders so that we do not build our lives around our fears but instead build a world shaped by God's love and the vision God gives us for the future. We especially need this reminder in these moments of great change and uncertainty.

This time of Covid-19 continues to reveal some difficult truths about our society. About how we care for our caregivers, about how we care for those who work all kinds of essential but less than glamourous jobs, about how we ensure that all the hungry are fed. Hopefully we don't lose sight of these people when things begin to feel more normal sometime in the future.

I have been so grateful for how well so many of you have handled the changes so far. We have a good group of folks that show up and say "hi" as soon as our worship video debuts Sunday morning. Those that came out for the drive-in communion helped things go smoothly. Our council even managed to hold an online Zoom meeting this month! Not to mention all the hands that have been busy sewing facemasks and all the folks calling and checking in on one another. Thank you all so much! But please, if you haven't been able to figure out this online stuff, give our office a call. We will be happy to offer what tech support we can or send you an audio CD, if that is what works best for you. We also have devotionals that can be picked up or mailed. And if you just need to hear a friendly voice, please give us a call!

Minutes of April 20, 2020, Council Meeting

<u>In attendance:</u> Dorothy Mundinger, Mary Braun, Pastor James Muske, Ron Haugland, Cheryl Malotky, Sherry Whipple and Dennis Hennessey.

The meeting was called to order by council vice president Dennis Hennessey.

Dennis Hennessey gave opening Devotions.

#### Secretary's Report:

Motion was made to accept the minutes of the March meeting by Mary Braun, seconded by Sherry Whipple, and passed.

#### Treasurer's Report:

Financial view and current month activity for March was presented by Mary Braun. Our offerings are down, especially "Loose Cash", but we have gotten some online donations from members via Facebook. \$925 for the month of April so far. We also have almost \$48,000 in stocks and saving accounts. YTD we are still on the positive side of our budget. Mary will be keeping virtual attendance for those listening to Sunday services online. Mary made a motion to take the Parsonage Pledge income, after payments were complete, and to move it to Parsonage Maintenance for accounting purposes. Seconded by Ron Haglund. Motion was made by Cheryl to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Sherry Whipple and passed.

#### Pastor's Report - April 20, 2020

Talk about a hectic month! Adjusting to the new quarantine reality has kept your pastor plenty busy. Much of my time this past month has been spent working on planning, filming and editing online worship service and other videos. As much as we try to make it seem familiar, we have definitely had to learn some new skills.

However, partnering with Faith Lutheran and Pastor Kate has been helpful in terms of sharing the workload. For example, when Pastor Kate writes the sermon and helps plan the service that allows me to spend more time editing the video.

Right now, with the equipment we have, it works better for us to record a service, rather than stream the service live. It also means we can use YouTube as the primary place for our videos (which is open to everyone), rather than rely only on Facebook (which requires an account).

We also benefitted from partnering with Bethlehem Lutheran for our first drive-in communion.

Bethlehem's piano player was able to play live music over our carillon system, which was quite lovely. I hope we can continue to offer communion this way, but maybe only once or twice a month.

We might even be able to expand on outdoor options during the summer, but, of course, everything depends on the guidelines that come from the government.

However, as busy as time on the computer has kept me, please feel free to give me a call if you need help or just need a friendly chat. I also encourage everyone to help provide a little mental and spiritual care with one another. Check in with those that may be stuck at home, trying to keep safe. And if you hear of bigger needs out there, please let us know if we can help gather support. And I know that many of you have already been doing this, so thank you! Setting up a Zoom meeting with confirmation kids soon.

So, thank you all for adjusting to this challenging new circumstances! And keep watching our website and Facebook for the latest info!

#### **Old Business:**

Stewardship Committee - needing new members. Job description is available at the church office. Electronic sign information is being worked on with a quote in a week or so.

Input on Gustavus Adolphus. This belongs to M&E and they have not had a meeting. Ken Skogquist Estate – check should be coming soon.

#### **New Business**

Committee Reports for council. None have been received because there have been no meetings. If individual committee's want to do a Zoom meeting, please check with the church office.

Payroll Protection Program Discussion (Loan/Grant). Council discussed if this is needed. We can apply though they have run out of money at the moment. It will either be a loan or a grant if we do apply. We don't really need the money to make our payroll yet and if we don't apply, it may be more beneficial to others that are more in need. We will table this and look at it next month if needed.

Input on Facebook and U-Tube church services and drive up Communion. - Another drive-up communion is being considered for May. In the pastor's report, he mentions the Facebook and U-Tube church services. We are looking at other options like outdoor services and utilizing other community partners.

Veggie Stand - Concerns about no jellies being made early May for Veggie Stand brought up a few ideas that Judie will bring to the Mission and Evangelism committee. Council thought that some of these ideas would give opportunities for parishioners to do something for our community.

Thoughts on CD renewal 4/22/2020 – The rate of interest will be .95%; it was 1.93%. There is a 10-day grace period. Mary made a motion that we leave the CD at MN Credit Union and revisit it next year. Ron seconded the motion and it passed.

Mary made a motion to allow the quilting ladies to continue their bi-monthly routine of quilting at church following hygiene and cleaning afterwards. Cheryl seconded the motion and it passed. If other groups feel they can meet safely, please check with the church office.

Cheryl made a motion for Mary to purchase a handy/dandy thermometer to check people when they come into the office. Motion was seconded by Ron and passed.

#### **Committee Reports:**

#### Faith, Health & Wellness Committee:

Because of the coronavirus shelter in place order our visits to members have been hindered. In early March prior to the shutdown we did have visits made to three people. Until things get opened up our focus will be on making phone calls to members, both those who are on our current list, but also to any other members who are sheltering in place and would benefit from a call.

Motion was made to adjourn by Dorothy, seconded by Cheryl, and passed.

The council closed with the Lord's Prayer. The next council meeting will be May 18th, 2020 at 10 am.

#### ELCA presiding bishop announces Covid-19 response

ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton has announced the launch of a comprehensive Covid-19 response across the ELCA beginning today.

The three approaches named are:

#### **Daily Bread Grants**

"ELCA World Hunger is announcing the immediate launch of Daily Bread Matching Grants," the announcement read. "Through these grants, ELCA congregations can raise funds for their feeding ministries using an online fundraising platform and will receive a grant of \$500 from ELCA World Hunger. Up to 100 Daily Bread Matching Grants are available for ELCA congregations on a first-come, first-served basis, with the possibility of more grants becoming available in the future. Apply or donate here."

**Here to Serve** "The ELCA churchwide organization is inherently a resource in support of the members, congregations, synods and partners of the

ELCA. During this time, Domestic Mission will pivot to a project-based, service-oriented structure so this church knows we are here to serve. By the first week of April, we will launch a chat function on **elca.org**, along with an 800 hotline for prayer, support and questions that will be answered by our staff. As soon as these channels are live, we will let you know."


