Though the way may be difficult, God will be with us.


We need not fear.

Paul writes: ¹So I made up my mind that I would not come to you again causing sorrow. ²For if I cause you sorrow, then who is there cheering me on but the one I have made sorrowful? ³And I wrote this very thing to you, so that when I came I wouldn't have sorrow from those who ought to make me rejoice—having confidence in you all that my joy is yours. ⁴For out of much distress and anguish of heart I wrote

to you with many tears—not to make you sorrowful, but to let you know the love that I have especially for you.

⁵But if anyone has caused sorrow, he has caused sorrow not to me, but to some extent—not to exaggerate—to all of you. ⁶For such a person, this punishment by the majority is enough. ⁷So instead you should forgive him and encourage him. Otherwise such a person might be swallowed up by excessive sorrow. ⁸Therefore I urge you to reaffirm your love for him. ⁹For to this end I also wrote that I might know your character, whether you are obedient in all things. ¹⁰Now anyone you forgive, I also forgive. For indeed, what I have forgiven (if I have forgiven anything), I did it for you in the presence of Messiah, ¹¹so that we might not be outwitted by satan—for we are not ignorant of his schemes.



Speak the words "The body of Christ, given for you" and "The blood of Christ, shed for you." You may then respond "Amen."


PRAYER after COMMUNION
