From the Pastor

¹⁰ Jesus called the crowd near and said to them, "Listen and understand. ¹¹ It's not what goes into the mouth that contaminates a person in God's

sight. It's what comes out of the mouth that contaminates the person." ... ¹⁸ But what goes out of the mouth comes from the heart. And that's what contaminates a person in God's sight. ¹⁹ Out of the heart come evil thoughts, murders, adultery, sexual sins, thefts, false testimonies, and insults. ²⁰ These contaminate a person in God's sight..." (Matthew 15:10–11)

³⁴ "I give you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, so you also must love each other. ³⁵ This is how everyone will know that you are my disciples, when you love each other." (John 13:34–35)

Greetings sisters and brothers in Christ!

Despite a few warm and glorious days near the end of September, autumn is most certainly upon us. All around us trees display their beautiful fall colors. Colors that are with the trees all year long, but only revealed now as the chlorophyll fades away.

Of course, it is also hard to miss other signs of fall. And by that, I mean the many literal political campaign signs that now dot the landscape wherever you go. Even in our world which often feels so divided, rarely do we so boldly display our beliefs. Not to say that this is necessarily a bad impulse, part of the hope in a democracy is that we can freely present and debate different beliefs, but I do wonder about their true impact, especially when you hear about people stealing them from their neighbors' lawns.

Yet, as people of faith, we also remember what Christ calls us to display first and foremost – our love for one another. Whatever our politics, whichever candidates we support, no matter which issue fires us up, Christ intends that through our words and our actions we proclaim our love for our neighbor, a living sign of the love that God has for all creation.

That is the tricky part, isn't it? It's not just that we are called to seem nice and loving in what we do and say – that can be challenging enough – but that we are called to display a love that demonstrates how *God* loves. Not love limited by our preferences and prejudices, not just for family or friends or fellow churchgoers, but an ever-expanding, boundless love. A patient and forgiving love. A wild and feisty and sometimes outright difficult love for even those who we see as our enemies. A love that both frees us from and holds us accountable for our sins.

Which, I admit, is kind of hard to pull off on one yard sign. I have seen some gigantic ones, but a sign to capture the love of God? Kind of tall order. However, a few of us around church have discussed an idea for a sign we could display in front of church. Something that might offer a bit of a reminder during this tumultuous time.

Perhaps you have seen a sign with big heart and the silhouette of Minnesota inside it, and the words "Your Neighbor" underneath. I know of at least one organization in St. Cloud that sells them as a fundraiser. We thought we could borrow that concept, but with an outline of Mille Lacs inside the heart, with those same words: (Love) Your Neighbor. A reminder that we are meant to be one community, all of us bound together. All of us, first and foremost, loved by God.

Not to limit it just to this one area, by any means. We could certainly pop an outline of the planet Earth in the middle too. God sets no geographical limits on the concept of neighbor. All of that evil that can fester in our hearts and spew out our mouths — there is no exception, no loophole, and no scapegoat allowed by God. All of that anger and selfishness contaminates our own bodies and our world, and so God works in our lives to teach us another way.

So just as we delight in the beauty of God's creation this fall, may we also be signs of God's love for all that he has created. And may that show forth even more boldly than even the most jam-packed flock of yard signs.

The meeting was called to order by council president George Smith.

Pastor James gave opening Devotions.

Secretary's Report:

Motion was made to accept the minutes of the August meeting by Mary Braun, seconded by Sherry Whipple, and passed.

Treasurer's Report:

Financial view and current month activity for August was presented by Mary Braun. Mary noted that we have paid out for all benevolences for the year. See report elsewhere in this newsletter. Motion was made by Dorothy Mundinger to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Ron Haglund and passed.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> (August 17 to September 21, 2020) It is hard to believe that summer is finally coming to an end, and with fall will likely mean more changes than just the leaves, ha.

My weeks continue to be packed with planning, recording, and editing videos for worship. Many thanks to the Praise Band for helping provide some lovely hymn singing for our services. Also many thanks for their leadership with our outdoor worship services.

However, we have probably come to an end with the outdoor worship services for the season. While folks can stay warm in their cars, it might get a bit chilly for those leading worship. So, we will need to think this month about if we want to reopen to in-person worship, on either a occasional or weekly basis. We should probably hold another Task Force meeting.

Confirmation classes began yesterday. Pastor Kate and I are combining our classes again, but the schedule is a bit different this year. Classes will meet twice per month in person, but with Zoom check-ins on the off weeks. Other adjustments are being considered. But sermon notes are not easier to complete than ever before, due to all our worship services being on YouTube!

The online Synod Assembly went relatively well this year. We elected a new bishop, Pastor Amy Odgren. Installation date for the bishop-elect is set for October 17, 2020 with a start date of November 1, 2020.

Still figuring out the details, but I would like to take a week off in October to visit my mother in her new home in Spearfish, SD. I might try to combine it with some continuing education. Covid precautions have made continuing ed opportunities difficult to arrange too.

Old Business

Edward Jones meeting — George and Dennis met with Mark at Edward Jones. They agreed to keep the same setup "Growth & Income" mode, which is a relative conservative fund that suits our needs. They also updated the signatures on the account. Survey results on opening the church —Mary emailed the council the result of the survey. Most people say that if we open, we need to wear our masks, use the Fellowship Hall, follow social distancing, leave doors open, limit handouts, space chairs in twos. So we will attempt to open for indoor service on October 25th with one service at 9:30 a.m. Lee Forrester is looking into purchasing an aerosol sanitizer for the church.

New council members needed — please consider! Update on TV's for fellowship hall — New TV's will be purchased for the Fellowship Hall, hopefully prior to our service on Oct. 25.

New Business

Committee Reports for Council - Mary Braun will distribute Budget Request forms by the end of Sept. to all committee chairpersons. Budget request forms are due by Oct. 25th also.

Aitkin County to use the building for flu shots was approved by council. See notice in this newsletter. 2020 Synod Assembly — A new bishop has been elected — Pastor Amy Odgren. The Synod Online Quilt Auction was very successful due to online bidding, raising over \$7,000.

Parsonage Driveway — Council voted earlier this month online to have the parsonage driveway paved and it passed. The driveway will be paid with the pledged funds from the Parsonage Pledges that ended in the Spring of 2020. The driveway is in the process of being redone.

Lion's Club request — Sherry Whipple requested the use of our kitchen facility to sponsor a drive-thru breakfast the Saturday before or after Veteran's Day. A motion was made to allow the Malmo Lions to use our facilities by Mary Braun. Motion was seconded by Ron Hauglund and passed.

Truck or Treat Event — Council agreed to an outdoor event only. See announcement elsewhere in this newsletter.

R.O.M.E.O.S. — Dennis asked if the men's group could start up again. He will call some of the members to discuss reopening.

Motion was made to adjourn by Sherry Whipple, seconded by Mary Braun, and passed.

The council closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Amy Odgren elected bishop of the ELCA Northeastern Minnesota Synod

CHICAGO — The Rev. Amy Odgren, Walker, Minn., was elected Aug. 29 to serve a six-

year term as bishop of the Northeastern Minnesota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during an online synod assembly.

Odgren was elected on the fifth ballot, with 167 votes. The Rev. David M. Carlson, pastor of Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Duluth, Minn., received 140 votes.

The bishop-elect has served as assistant to the bishop and director for evangelical mission in the Northeastern Minnesota Synod since 2016. She served as pastor of Spirit Lutheran Church (2015 to 2016) and as pastor and redeveloper of First Lutheran Church (2013 to 2015), both in Eau Claire, Wis.

Odgren also served as assistant to the bishop and director for evangelical mission in the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin (2007 to 2013); associate pastor of First in Eau Claire (2003 to 2007), and mission developer pastor of Bridge of Life Lutheran Church in Holmen, Wis. (2001 to 2003).

Odgren received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Minn., in 1980 and a Master of Divinity degree from Wartburg Theological Seminary, Dubuque, Iowa, in 2001. Gustavus is one of 26 ELCA colleges and universities. Wartburg is one of seven ELCA seminaries.

Odgren's installation is scheduled for Oct. 17.
