From the Pastor

Greetings, sisters and brothers in Christ! Besides the making (and perhaps quickly breaking) of resolutions around the start of a new year, for many there is also the tradition of hanging a new calendar. A traditional perhaps dwindling a bit in

the modern digital age, but even if you are not the sort that keeps their life in order by filling a calendar with hand-written notes, there is the aesthetic appeal of rotating through a beautiful series of images. And, frankly, some of us need all the reminders we can get for important holidays and birthdays that, despite keeping the same date each year, always manage to sneak up on us.

The big holiday this month, of course, is Valentine's Day. A day that people either love or loath, regardless of whether they are partnered or single. Both camps likely have good reasons for their opinion, but perhaps there is something about the nature of holidays themselves that either delight or stress us.

Holidays usually concentrate and focus our attention on a specific topic. Love and romance on Valentine's Day. Presidents on Presidents. Green beer and various Irish stereotypes on St. Patty's Day, etc. Holding up that magnifying glass on that one day a year might highlight something great... or reveal something less admirable.

If you *only* show affection to your partner on Valentine's Day, don't be surprised if they aren't as impressed at your romantic overtures. Similarly, we shouldn't only reflect on what makes for a good leader on President's Day, and why we are grateful for Irish Americans on St. Patrick's Day. We should take particular care to look beyond the holiday when remembrances focus on groups of people within our country. Last month we had Martin Luther King Jr. Day and this month is Black History Month. Next month is Women's History Month. A month is decent span of time, but, still, our efforts at learning, listening, honoring, and, if necessary, changing, should not be limited to neat and tidy timeframes. It should just become a regular part of who we are.

So, as we move through our calendar this year and as we come upon one holiday after another, take time to reflect how we might honor the occasion for more than just one specific day. How do we share love beyond Valentines, how do we show love for our country beyond July 4th, how do we honor our fathers and mothers and veterans and all our neighbors as part of how we live our lives every day? And don't forget, there are all those religious holidays too! We may tell certain stories at certain times of year, we may explore specific themes depending on the liturgical season, but we should not just be generous and joyous in December and reflective and repentant in Lent. Even though Ecclesiastes (and the Byrds!) reminds us that "for everything there is a season," you are under no obligation to wait for the official season or holiday to live the life God calls you to live each day. Never forget - God is with us, each and every day on our calendars, now and forever. Yours in Christ.

New Digital Sign

Real-life sacrifice

"I love to help the people who need it most. ... Seeing people who are needy motivates me to help." Amazingly, these aren't the words of a wealthy or comfortable person but of a teenager who, herself, is among the world's poorest. Her family lives in a Chilean slum and is assisted by a Christian human-services agency.

When fire broke out near the 16-year-old's home, leaving 220 already-destitute families homeless, the girl and her mother donated their own blankets, towels and other supplies to people who'd lost the little they had. Her mother even gave away clothes she'd planned to sell for much-needed household income.



I was humbled to read of this girl and her mom. So often I "have contributed out of [my] abundance"; but this pair, "out of [their] poverty ... put in ... all [they] had to live on" (Mark 12:44, NRSV).
