### **From the Pastor**

Greetings and blessings to you, fellow disciples in Christ!

In her book "Help, Thanks, Wow," author Anne Lamott offers this prayer:

Hi, God.
I am just a mess.
It is all hopeless.
What else is new?
I would be sick of me, if I were You, but
miraculously You are not.
I know I have no control over other people's
lives, and I hate this. Yet I believe that if I
accept this and surrender, You will meet me
wherever I am.

Wow. Can this be true? If so, how is this afternoon – say, two-ish?

Thank You in advance for Your company and blessings.

You have never once let me down. Amen.

Her book makes a couple important points – one, that while there are many finely-crafted prayers, even simple prayers, prayed honestly and from the heart, work perfectly well; and two, that when it comes to simple prayers, three essential prayers are "help," "thanks," and "wow" (hence the title).

I have been thinking about her book as our men's group has been starting to study the Psalms. Lamott must be well versed in them, as the Psalms frequently feature these three prayers. I especially love those psalms that may start as a "thanks" or "wow" prayer but are really a "help" prayer in the flimsiest of disguises. And if we can see through the subterfuge, God must just be rolling his eyes.

The psalmist proclaims, in one breath, that God is good, that God is ever faithful, that God lifts up the lowly and punishes evildoers, and then, in the next breath, offers a whole laundry list of complaints about how their life is going.

I had a professor in seminary that would joke that we have a bit of latitude in interpreting these psalms and

the psalmist who wrote them — either we can see them as completely sincere, that their faith is strong and that no matter what befalls them, they trust completely in God... or we can view the fluctuations between praise and lament as a bit of a divine guilt trip. As if the psalmist is praying: "O God, you are great and wonderful and powerful and ever-faithful to your people.... anyway, while I have you, quick update, my life is consumed by suffering right now. I am sick, I am depressed, the world has gone nuts and everyone is against me, sooo, O ever-faithful God, not to put you on the spot, but I could use some of that ever-faithfulness right now. Please?!" Or, as Lamott puts it above, "How about this afternoon?"

Our recent Mental Health First Aid class made the point that one of the most profound gifts we can offer another person is to simply listen to them. To be there for them, without judgement, without rushing into fix it mode, and to be open to understanding, but not instantly assume that we do. This is also the gift of prayer and our conversations with God... or at least it should be.

We shouldn't be afraid to be fully open with God, even if our prayers aren't particularly pretty or happy or even ask some tough questions of God. Just as long, of course, as we are also willing to be open with God when it is God that is doing the talking and asking tough questions of us! Just as we may grow impatient, so too do we (most definitely) test God's patience.

As we enjoy these lovely early summer days, this is a perfect time to reconnect with one another and maybe even introduce yourself to someone new. But even as we may be excited to "get back to normal," don't be afraid to make room in your conversations to let people unburden themselves of all the stresses we have been carrying over the last couple years. Of course, we hope that we can just "get back to normal" (whatever that means) without a lot of uncomfortable conversations, but, in the long run, we do well to be open, with God and with one another, about when we need help, when we give thanks, and when we are filled with "wow," and everything in between.

The meeting was called to order by council president Dennis Hennessy

Pastor James gave opening Devotions.

#### Secretary's Report:

Motion was made to accept the minutes of the April meeting by Sherry Whipple and seconded by Mary Braun and passed.

#### Treasurer's Report:

Financial view and current month activity for April was presented by Mary Braun. Donations towards the digital signage was discussed. See Appeal in this newsletter. Mary noted she was attending a webinar on managing parish fixed assets. Motion was made by Sherry Whipple to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Dick Stebbins and passed.

#### Pastor's Report - April 18 - May 16, 2022

Here are some highlights from the past month: Attended the Synod Assembly with Julie and Patti. Nice to have these large in-person gatherings again. Thanks to Dennis for leading worship!

Been working on a world music themed worship service that the Worship & Music committee has been discussing. Still a work in progress but should be a great way to highlight the many gifts of our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ through music and prayer.

The men's group and I enjoyed the prayer breakfast held at Faith Lutheran as part of the National Day of Prayer.

I also attended an event on the Mille Lacs Reservation around the topic of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, an important issue in native communities in our country.

Participated in both sessions of the Mental Health First Aid class (as well as providing some help with setup and tech support). A great class I hope we can offer again to our church and others in the community.

Pastoral care visits included four in-person visits and 16 phone calls.

Also spent time working on sabbatical plans. Decided not to apply for the grant mentioned last month but helped firm up ideas with the help of Julie Swaggert. Would like to propose taking my sabbatical starting in August to the end of October. While this may seem a bit soon, it helps avoid busy times of year like Christmas and Easter.

Julie, as Personnel Committee Chair (and someone who has taken a sabbatical), will continue working with me to help create a good balance between more restful activities and learning opportunities. She will also work with us to help find coverage. I have already begun speaking with a few pastors. I will plan to share a more detailed outline next month, once the timeline is approved (and could also hold a session after worship this summer), one main theme of my time will be to visit other ELCA ministries within Native American communities similar to ours, both in Minnesota and in other states. I also plan to spend some of my relaxation time outdoors, either hiking, biking, or on the water. I am also on the wait list for a cedar canoe building class at the North House Folk School in Grand Marais. As mentioned previously, I will be taking some continuing education time this week, attending the Festival of Homiletics (preaching conference) online. So great to see so many folks on Sunday morning, including some new people! Thanks to all of you for your support of our ministry!

#### **Old Business**

Digital Sign is scheduled for delivery soon. Sherry Whipple noted that the Lions are interested in purchasing the old sign. She will let us know. Mental Health First Aid was a huge success and beneficial to all that attended. We hope to have another class next fall.

Vice-President — We appeal to anyone to please step up to fill this office.

#### **New Business**

Summer worship schedule – The survey results are that the majority want one Sunday 9:00 a.m. service. Also, there was a high percentage that want Sunday school, but with lack of children and no one wanting to teach, the council is reluctant to begin one. Stewardship — Council discussed financials, making sure we are on target. It was suggested we have an article in the newsletter.

#### **Committee Reports**

Update on Mission and Evangelism responsibilities and activities during the past months (Online spring meeting, May 2022):

Our group called a meeting responding to a request for more adult education. It was a successful brain storming session that resulted in the successful End of Life Series being held at Bethesda.

Now, the First Aid for Mental Health sessions on May 3 and May 10 are being promoted as a part of Adult Education.

Sunday School was not offered this past season as we do not have teachers. Our committee needs to address the situation and perhaps try to form a Children's Education Program. We did ask for input in the May newsletter.

Vacation Bible School is being planned for June 20-23 for classes and day 5 Friday as a possible service project day.

Game and Movie Sundays were held throughout the winter months. Thank You to those who helped with these events. One more game day is being planned as a Corn Hole Tournament on May 22.

There will be new members joining Bethesda on June 5, 2022. Our committee will ask individual members to be sponsors and attend church with them on June 5. Letters will be sent out welcoming the new members and confirming the sponsor's commitment. 
