#### **From the Council President**

Jesus Christ death paid the price of our spiritual freedom from spiritual death. He accomplished what the Law could not and what no other person could do. Allowing us to accept the gift of His sacrifice brings us back into harmony with God.

What is our responsibility after accepting this gift? We know from the Apostle Paul that we are expected to be different than we were. Love is to replace hate. Generosity is to replace greed. Truth is to replace lying. Acceptance is to replace denial. We are to treat others as we would like to be treated.

No one individual can make another individual change. Change has to happen within us. But that is the problem, isn't it? We often feel that we are being forced to change to please others or that we have to change which is a very difficult thing to do.

Freedom requires us to look at our lives objectively and determine if we are free from things that bind us to this world or to heaven. None of us is perfect. None of us has all the correct answers, but we do have a loving God who does have the answers and the power to carry it out.

White supremacy, gun violence, Christian nationalism, book banning, lying and violence are not what Jesus preached. Jesus did preach about love and acceptance which leads to Freedom for the Spirit.

When does my freedom end? Does it end because I cannot own assault rifles? Does it end when someone else's faith is respected as much as mine? Does freedom end when people with different colored skin are given the same rights as me? Or does it end when I do not allow someone the same rights and respect that I have?

The news is filled with problems and offers no solutions. Blaming will not change anything. I can only change things in my own life. My part is not to add to the chaos but to anchor myself to faith in a loving God. It is easy to look at this mess and give up, but I cannot give up. My trial is to face these problems and do my part to be a solution to them.

I will continue to read and keep myself informed and discern if what I am reading, hearing is true or not. I challenge you to expand your horizons and examine life without judging others. I must. Accept that others do have a right to their own beliefs and lifestyles. The most difficult part of life I have found is in not judging others and trying to understand their point of view.

My purpose here is to remind us of the need to look to God when the world wants us to be bound to fear. This will help us see clearly that it is our fear that binds us to this world and that it is our faith that will provide an answer to our problems. I know it is difficult to look at the world and not be terrified or lose to hopelessness. But it is at these times that we need to look to God in order to overcome this world.

- Julie and I have been working on sabbatical coverage and other plans, both for the congregation and my own personal agenda.
   Preaching coverage is coming along nicely.
- One item we need to discuss is pastoral care coverage while I am gone. I have spoken with Darlene and Faith, Health and Wellness about visitations, but we would be well served to form an arrangement with an ordained pastor for emergency needs. Pastor Jess from Bethany Lutheran in Onamia has indicated she would be willing to help, as she currently serves in a part time call.
- I have also been reviewing books and devotionals that our study groups might read in my absence. I will try to sit down with some potential leaders to discuss a plan for both the men's and women's groups.
- I have been preparing for my VBS sessions next week. Thanks to Joanne and everyone else for all the hard work they put into to

- making this happen!
- This month is my turn at leading worship services in the Aitkin care facilities.
- We had a new member Sunday, welcome to all these great folks!
- Pastoral care visits included three in-person visits and 7 phone calls.
- Would like to take Monday, June 27 and Tuesday, June 28 off to attend a family gathering.

#### **Old Business**

- Digital Sign is supposed to be delivered today (June 13)
- Mary and Dennis plan to go update authorized signers on bank account after VBS
- Summer worship schedule for now, it was decided to stay with one service. Council will review again next month.
- Old Sign an offer to buy our old sign is being considered.

#### **New Business**

- Sabbatical Pastor's sabbatical is approved. We reviewed financials for this and we have money available for pulpit supply while he is gone. Pastor James will have a schedule down by next month's meeting along with a list of pastors on retainer.
- VBS starts next week! Joanne reported they have about 25 children registered at the moment.
- Mary and Dennis will look into putting higher insurance on our new sign.
- 'Snapshot of Thanks' Show us what you're thankful for ... that big fish you caught, the beautiful sunset photo you captured, flowers, birds, deer, etc...you get the picture! Photos will be displayed at Sunday service.

#### **Committee Reports**

Parish Nurse/FHW/Outreach Ministry for May.

A Faith, Health and Wellness meeting was held on Tuesday, May 24<sup>th</sup> with 7 members attending.

Visits with communion were made to four members by Pastor and Darlene and to one member by Darlene. Regular phone calls are also being made by three other members. A list has been compiled of members who may need home visits with communion or regular phone calls. While Pastor is

on sabbatical a plan needs to be made as to how phone calls and visits will be done. Three people are interested in being trained in bringing home communion and a training session will be set up. The Outreach Ministry goal is to stay connected to members who are unable to attend services either through visits or phone calls or with those having short term medical issues.

The following items fall under the Faith, Health and Wellness umbrella and each has a member who is responsible for an area: grief support, prayer shawls, baby bundles, care notes, card ministry, loan closet, soup and cookie ministry, blood pressure screening and health education. An AED education session will be set up and monthly blood pressure screenings resumed.

Motion was made to adjourn the meeting by Mary Braun and seconded by Dick Stebbins, and passed. The council closed with the Lord's Prayer.

The next council meeting will be July 18 at 10 am.



The only difference in a pollinator garden and a Monarch Waystation is that milkweed (a native plant-not a weed) must be present to be considered a Monarch Waystation.
