

Dear friends in Christ,

I write this letter to all of you with excitement that is mixed with sadness. On Monday, June 24, I shared my resignation as the pastor of Bethesda Lutheran Church with our council president. I took this action because I have accepted a call to be the Lead Pastor of St. Stephen the Martyr Lutheran Church in White Bear Lake, MN.

During the month of July, I will continue to preach and minister to the needs of this congregation. **My last Sunday will be July 28th.** Our council president Dean Malotky is in contact with staff from the NEMN Synod, so that they may support Bethesda during this time of transition.

As happy as I am to begin this next stage in my life and my ministry, it was by no means an easy decision. Please know that this transition is not a reflection on my time here or my hopes for this congregation. On the contrary, though we have been through some difficult moments as a congregation, I am so grateful for the past six years and will miss this community deeply. I also continue to be hopeful about the future of Bethesda Lutheran – all of you bring so many gifts to this ministry and God's love is truly lived out here!

As an important reminder, though I will continue to provide pastoral duties until the end of July, after that time I am required to exercise appropriate boundaries, so that you may form stronger relationships with any new clergy or leadership. This means that I cannot preside over funerals or weddings, conduct visits, or offer advice on governance issues at Bethesda, but if there are any important community milestones that I might attend as a visitor, please send me an invite!

Please know that I will always treasure the ministry that I have shared with all of you. Though my relationship as your pastor will change, my love for you will not. So, even as I feel called to serve this new congregation, this was indeed a difficult decision. The difficulty is not in saying yes to the Lord, but in saying goodbye to all of you. You are good people with hearts to serve and follow our Lord. You have invited me into your lives in such humbling ways. As I depart from this special place, I will continue to pray that God guides you and gives you strength in your ministry as a congregation.

May God continue to bless and keep you!
