- Darlene Christensen handed out a list of projects and Thrivent members for possible Thrivent grants. Members are able to receive \$250 twice a year from Thrivent. One project will be buying batting for Bethesda's quilters.
- The Fall Gathering will be at Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Baxter on October 5. Those going will carpool. Further information as to time we leave will be given when program is available.
- Diaper Day for Global Health Ministries is being held at Hope Lutheran Church in Walker. Their goal is 1,000 diapers for 500 newborn kits for the 2025 Summer Gathering. Darlene Christensen will get Bethesda's In Kind newborn kits program

together in the spring. Last spring our WELCA made 71 kits for the 2024 Summer Gathering.
