Highlights from the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly The wider church gathered in Phoenix for the Churchwide Assembly, the official decision making body of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. This gathering happens once every three years and helps set the direction for our shared life in Christ. This year, two significant elections took place:

- Bishop Yehiel Curry was elected Presiding Bishop. Bishop Curry currently serves the Metro Chicago Synod. He is known as a dynamic, grounded leader, with a background in teaching and social work before being called by his home congregation into pastoral ministry.
- Rev. CeCee Mills was elected Secretary of the ELCA. Rev. Mills serves as Assistant to the Bishop in North Carolina and has long been active in renewal movements within the church. Both Bishop Curry and Secretary Mills bring a passion for mission development and raising up new ministries.

They are the first African-American leaders to hold these two top offices in the ELCA, which is a historic and hopeful moment for our church. This also reminds us of the global Lutheran community, 77 million Lutherans worldwide, with the largest numbers in Ethiopia and Tanzania. The “average Lutheran” today is an African woman in her 30s. For those of us in a denomination that is 98% white, this is a call to faithful allyship. I will be reading *See Me, Believe Me: A Guide to Deepen Allyship with Congregational Leaders of Color* by Rev. Yolanda Denson-Byers, and I’ve ordered copies for our Church Council. I also have extra copies available for anyone else who would like to participate in this faithful work. This is an opportunity for us to prepare ourselves, as leaders and as a congregation, to support our new Presiding Bishop and Secretary and to help shape a more welcoming and faithful church. Beyond these elections, the Assembly took important actions, including:

- Adopting a new social statement on Faith & Civic Life
- Reaffirming commitments to justice and peace in Palestine

- Addressing the history of Indian Boarding Schools
- Naming the crisis of Missing & Murdered Indigenous Women & Girls
- Lifting up climate justice, racial justice, and advocacy for those facing deportation
- Strengthening unity with the Eastern Church on the Nicene Creed
- Teaching and study on God’s Word, human sexuality, and the life of our church.

I encourage anyone in our congregation who feels a spark of interest to consider getting involved in synod or churchwide ministries. Our church is always in motion, and your voice and gifts are deeply needed.

At the recent ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, our denomination elected two new leaders; Bishop Yehiel Curry as Presiding Bishop and Rev. CeCee Mills as Secretary. This is the first time in ELCA history that both offices are held by leaders of color, a milestone worth celebrating. In light of this, I am inviting our Council and anyone in the congregation who would like to join us to read *See Me, Believe Me: A Guide to Deepen Allyship with Congregational Leaders of Color* by Rev. Yolanda Denson-Byers. It’s a way for us to learn, grow, and support our new leaders with faithfulness and grace.

You may also have noticed that the sanctuary doors now remain open throughout worship. This simple act is more than practical it reflects our ELCA calling to embody Christ's welcome, offering hospitality, safety, and a reminder that the Gospel is always open and flowing into the world.
