## Parish Nurse Notes

### Hope Lodge Thrivent Action Team Event

During the month of October Bethesda will be collecting paper products (toilet paper, paper towels, Kleenex and napkins) for Hope Lodge's fall project "TP the Lodge".

Hope Lodge in Minneapolis opened in 2007 and it provides a free, safe home away from home for cancer patients and their caregivers during active cancer treatments. Guests have a private fully furnished room and bathroom, plus access to a community kitchen, laundry room with free supplies, indoor and outdoor gathering spaces for meditation and reflection, library and movie room. It is staffed 24/7 to provide programming and to assist with any needs their guests may have.

Paper products can be brought to the church during October and will be delivered to Hope Lodge. Watch the bulletin announcements for other supplies that are needed at Hope Lodge.

### Soup and Cookie Ministry

Bethesda's Visitation Team brings cookies, soup and other food items to the shut ins they visit each month. If you have extra cookies, bars, soup or a hotdish, put them in the freezer in the pantry. The door has a compartment labeled for the visitation team.



## UPDATE ON BIKES TO THE VILLAGE OF HOPE IN ZAMBIA

On Monday, September 15<sup>th</sup>, Lee Forrester,

Dave Stueven and Dennis Hennessy packed up the 45 adult and kids bikes that Bethesda had collected and transported them to Zion Lutheran Church in Buffalo. This was the first step of the journey the bikes will be taking to the Village of Hope in Zambia, Africa. We are the only church that collected bikes. A church in Wisconsin brought school desks, chairs, file cabinets and more. Zion's focus was medical equipment and supplies as the Village of Hope is building a medical clinic. Everything from exam tables to IV stands to more technical equipment and supplies has been collected and is also ready to be packed. Purchasing and sending a huge container is a massive project. Our bikes and funds (from pancake breakfast and other donations) were both appreciated and needed!

The bikes and those who transported them were greeted in Buffalo by Zion folks who helped unload the bikes and readied them for packing. On Wednesday, September 17<sup>th</sup>, the large container arrived in Buffalo (40 feet long, 10 feet wide and 9 feet high). The goal for Zion is to have the container ready to be shipped by October 1<sup>st</sup> with hopes of the container arriving in Zambia by early January of 2026.



We will continue to update you during the next few weeks and months of the progress the container is making towards the Village of Hope. Here is a brief outline of the route:

- Container shipped via semi-truck to Minneapolis
- Container boards a train in Minneapolis and heads to New York
- In New York the container goes on a large ship and heads to Africa

- The container's first stop in Africa is Dar es Salaam Tanzania
- After it clears customs, another semi takes the container through Tanzania
- Another customs check in Zambia and then to the Village of Hope.

Pray for safe travels as this is a long journey! Thanks so much for ALL of the help and prayers.
