Reign of Christ Sunday is celebrated on the final Sunday after Pentecost marking the completion of the church year and prepares us for the beginning of Advent by serving as both climax and bridge, a time to rejoice in the fullness of Christ's love and to look forward with hope to God's promised renewal of all creation.

This festival proclaims that Christ's reign is not about earthly power or dominance but about mercy, justice, and peace. In Christ, God reconciles all things and gathers the whole creation into divine love. The hope we carry into Advent is born from the story of Christ's life, death, and resurrection as revealed through the seasons of the church year.

As we close one liturgical year and prepare to begin another, we give thanks for the ways Christ has been made known among us and for the Spirit's ongoing work of healing and renewal in the world.

ADVENT: HOPE AND PROMISE

Advent marks the beginning of the Christian year. It is a season of hope and preparation as we watch and wait for God's promise to unfold. We remember that Christ comes among us in many ways: in the story of his birth, in the presence of the Spirit, and in the promise that God's reign of justice and peace will be made complete.

EPIPHANY: LIGHT TO THE NATIONS

Epiphany means "manifestation" or "revealing." In this season, we celebrate the ways Christ is made known to the world. From the visit of the Magi to the waters of baptism and the call of the first disciples, God's light is revealed for all people, showing that the good news of Jesus is meant for the whole creation.

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THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD: IDENTITY AND BELOVEDNESS

As we remember this story, we are reminded that through our own baptism we too are named and claimed as God's beloved children, called to live out God's mercy in the world.
